## Privacy Standards Conference

As recommended to the International Organization for Standardization (ISO) Technical Management Board (TMB) by the ISO TMB Task Force on Privacy in (Document number), the ISO Privacy Steering Committee (PSC) is holding this first ISO Privacy Standards Conference in Berlin, Germany. The overall goal of this conference is to foster information sharing and coordination among committees engaged in privacy standards work, i.e., among those ISO technical committees and other important stakeholders, which

- are working on standards containing provisions in regard to the protection of personal identifiable information (PII), commonly known as data privacy;
- have a need to refer to standards dedicated to this subject; or
- have additional data privacy interests not currently addressed by formal standards, fora, or consortia standards or guidelines.

The concerned ISO technical committees and important stakeholder organizations will have the opportunity to express their position on the primary and additional tasks of the ISO/TMB PSC 01 contained in its terms of reference (PSC01N0016) and the ISO TMB privacy task force final report (both attached) and to discuss the privacy work underway in their committees or organizations.

Legal instruments and the discussion of the need for world-wide regulatory harmonization will not be a subject of this conference and is not within the scope of ISO standardization. However, since standardization always needs to consider the legal environment, the Conference includes contributions originating from government officials.
