

Call for Papers - Special Track on Trusted Computing Platforms

The 2003 International Conference on Security and Management (SAM'03)

June 23 - 26, 2003
Monte Carlo Resort, Las Vegas, Nevada, USA

The SAM'03 Conference will be held simultaneously with a number of other international conferences and workshops and will be sponsored by the World Academy of Sciences and co-sponsored by CSREA.

This year, SAM'03 introduces a new Trusted Computing Platforms track aimed at promoting discussion on industry efforts to implement security technologies. For this track, we are soliciting panel proposals.

You are invited to submit a paper of about 5 pages (see below for submission information) or a panel proposal. All accepted papers will be published in the conference proceedings.

SUBMISSION OF PAPERS AND PANEL PROPOSALS

Prospective authors are invited to submit a copy of draft paper (about 5 pages - single spaced, font-size of 10 to 12) to Selim Aissi @ selim.aisi@intel.com by the due date.

The length of the Camera-Ready papers (if accepted) will be limited to 7 (IEEE style) pages. Papers must not have been previously published or currently submitted for publication elsewhere. Panel proposals should be no longer than three pages in length, should include possible panelists, and should include an indication of which panelists have confirmed participation.

The first page of the paper or panel proposal should include: title of the paper, name, affiliation, postal address, E-mail address, telephone number, and Fax number for each author. The first page should also include the name of the author who will be presenting the paper (if accepted) and a maximum of 5 keywords.
