For example, EFTS is superseded by FBI EBTS and the DoD EBTS is moving to version 2.0</p> <p>In addition, consider adding INT-I.</p> <p>As a general concern, how does the fact that ANSI/NIST-ITL 2-2008 exists affect things? It is the XML version of the ANSI/NIST standard. EBTS and others application profiles will be modified to handled this standard in the future. Does this mean a substantive update to BIAS?</p>

If this is proposed as an international standard, certain data should be required to limit the need to customize messages for each country. A true international standard would save time and money as we work with other countries.</p>		
INCIT S-3	3.2.21	Page 20, Line 223	TM	<p>Change fields unspecified and XML_BIR to Format and BIR_Info</p>	<p>Rather than having an unspecified format or XML_BIR, it would make sense to have the format of the data as a field and then the representation as a subsequent field.</p>	
INCIT S-4	3.2.21	Page 20, Line 223	TM	<p>1) Increase flexibility of biometric data elements as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a. Allow either a full BIR or just a BDB. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - This may require an element (or tag) to indicate which it is. - If a BDB only is provided, the BIAS CBEFF XML header may be used to provide metadata. b. Allow non-binary BIRs/BDBs. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Currently, data is carried just as binary BIRs. There are a number of XML data formats now available (e.g., VoiceXML, ANSI/NIST part 2, NIEM). These should be allowed to be carried in their native XML format rather than requiring the entire record to be base 64 encoded. c. Allow a URI to be provided as a BIR/BDB (rather than just embedded/attached data). <p>2) It is recognized that these changes, if accepted, may</p>
