



<u>The OriginBX Foundation</u> will advance data standards for an open source, blockchain platform-of-platforms to unify the creation and exchange of trusted digital certifications of origin. HTS classification, export controls, customs value, and other admissibility assertions for customs and related government agency laws and regulations are also supported.

The OriginBX Foundation will be governed by an international alliance of organizations and supported by the <u>OASIS Open</u> nonprofit standards consortium, which is the home of standards that include Baseline, SAML, STIX, UBL, and ebXML.

Anyone will be able to participate technically in the OriginBX open source community without paying a fee. Funding will be provided by a core group of stakeholder organizations whose commitment will ensure that the work stays on-track and receives the resources it needs to succeed. Longer term, a small percentage of the revenue generated from platform usage fees may be applied to supporting further development of the platform as well as trade facilitation grants to customs administrations and SMEs located in lesser developed countries.

OriginBX's success is important for your company

Existing free trade agreement software providers, provenance blockchain platforms, eCommerce platforms, and customs agencies all will be able to utilize the data standards established by the OriginBX OASIS project to obtain and immutably record the analysis and conclusions that must be certified and declared to customs and related cross-border control agencies.

Unlike track-and-trace provenance blockchains, the data standards established by OriginBX OASIS project will solve the complexities of goods consisting of many components, ingredients, or multiple levels of bills of material in multi-tiered supply chains.
